



In response to COVID-19, and to protect our participants, visitors, and staff, we are abiding by the following procedures:

- Individuals with a fever, and those not feeling well, are asked to not enter the studio.
- Per the Governor's Executive Order 2020-147, anyone entering the studio must be wearing a mask or face covering, unless medically unable to do so.
- Upon entering the studio, all individuals are asked to use hand sanitizer, which will be provided.
- Outside food will not be allowed in the studio unless medically necessary for a student. Students may bring drinks in covered containers.
- During class, only registered students may enter the studio. If students need direct assistance during class, they may enter the studio with their caregiver.
- During class, any parents or caregivers waiting for students will be asked to maintain 6-foot social distancing if remaining in the building.
- Class protocols:
 - A maximum of 10 people are allowed in the studio during classes. This includes the teaching artist, ACT staff, students, and caregivers. Parents and caregivers who are not needed to provide direct assistance to students are asked to wait outside the studio.
 - For indoor classes, all individuals must wear a mask or face covering at all times, unless medically unable to do so.
 - All individuals in class must maintain a 6-foot distance (unless students are being assisted by the teaching artist, ACT staff, or caregiver).
 - Class supplies will be sanitized before and after class.
 - Students will not be allowed to share supplies during class.
 - The ACT studio and high-traffic areas in the building, such as the elevator buttons and stairway railing, will be sanitized before and after class.
